

Art Circle Public Library's Winter Artist:

Lynne Looney



This January and February, an explosion of color is coming to the Art Circle Public Library with the latest installation of paintings by local artist Lynne Looney.

Raised in Central Texas, Ms. Looney was surrounded by earth tones, somber colors and big skies. Only after spending several years in the mountains of Central Mexico completing her bachelor of art in painting at the Instituto Allende in San Miguel de Allende, Guanajuato, Mexico did her color palette shift to hot yellows and reds and vibrant greens and blues. The large scale influence of her work comes from working professionally in the Atlanta area designing and producing sets and backdrops for the theater and entertainment industries.

Three areas of subject concentration will be on display. Abstracts will be featured in the Meeting Room Gallery while Florals will hang in the Vestibule Gallery, and Landscapes will adorn the wall adjacent to the ground floor elevator showing big Texas skies and Tennessee mountain mists.

Ms. Looney has conducted various watercolor and acrylic demonstrations for the Art Circle Public Library as well as lending her creative talents to transform the children's library windows for holiday celebrations.
